Eastern Shawnee Tribe Give Students Backpacks Filled With School Supplies



The Eastern Shawnee held its annual Shawna Stovall Children's back-to-school Pow Wow on August 7th. With corona virus cases rising, the tribe had a drive-through backpack and supply drive instead of their usual Pow Wow and dinner. Families drove through the parking lot of Bordertown Casino to get free backpacks and school supplies. "It's important because a lot of people struggle to get school supplies and backpacks. Especially larger families, and it's something we can do, and we enjoy being able to help in that way," said Diane Torres, Eastern Shawnee Tribe CCDF Program Director. The tribe gave away 750 backpacks and 97 toddler backpacks along with t-shirts and toys.

Larry Dushane

Laurence “Larry” Howard Dushane passed from this world July 9, 2021 at his home surrounded by family in Grove, OK, at the age of 78. Born December 5, 1942 in Kingman, AZ, to Howard Spear Dushane and Leona Evelyn (Wilkie McGee) Dushane, Larry was welcomed by sister, Linda.

Following his graduation from Harlem, Montana, in 1960 he served in the Navy (1963 – 1967) as a sonar specialist and then as a Navy Reservist (1975 – 1979). He continued his electronics and mathematics studies at Fort Lewis College in Durango, CO.

He began his professional career with AT&T in Albuquerque, NM, and later worked in their San Francisco, CA, and Kansas City, MO, offices for 28 years as a Network Systems Analyst. After retiring from AT&T in 1998, Larry worked setting up modular homes and eventually established his own home repair business in Grove, OK. In 2009 he began working for his own tribe as the Eastern Shawnee Tribe’s Hardship Coordinator, in Seneca, MO, through 2020.

Larry married Robin Ann (Roark) Miller on June 28, 1998. They resided in the Grand Lake area where he continued to enjoy his favorite past times; fishing, hunting and participating in tribal culture for 23 years.

Larry was preceded in death by his parents and one sister. Emergency Rental Assistance Program

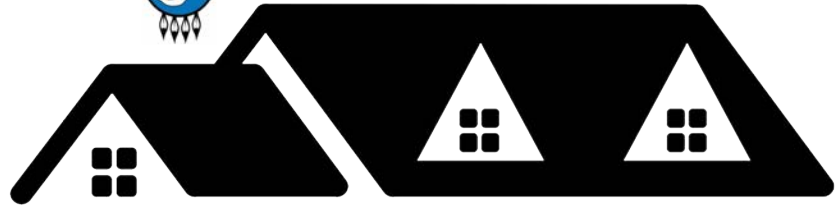
The purpose of the Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma Emergency Rental Assistance Program is to provide direct financial assistance, including rent, rental arrears, utilities and home energy costs, utilities and home energy costs arrears, and other expenses related to housing. This program will make available a limited amount of assistance to households that are unable to pay rent and utilities due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This program will serve eligible households and is subject to available program funding. This program will end on December 31, 2021.

Eligibility:

1. Qualifies for unemployment or

EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

has experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due, directly or indirectly, to the Covid-19 out-

break.

2. Demonstrates a risk of experiencing homelessness (rent) or housing instability (utilities and other expenses); and
3. Has a household income at or below 80 percent of your area median (FY 2020).

Assistance Provided:

1. Rent
2. Rental arrears
3. Utilities (electric, gas, water and sewer, fuel oil)
4. Utility arrears
5. Internet

Eligible households may apply and receive up to three months of assistance at a time, provided funds are available. A maximum of 12 months assistance or \$3,000, whichever should come first.

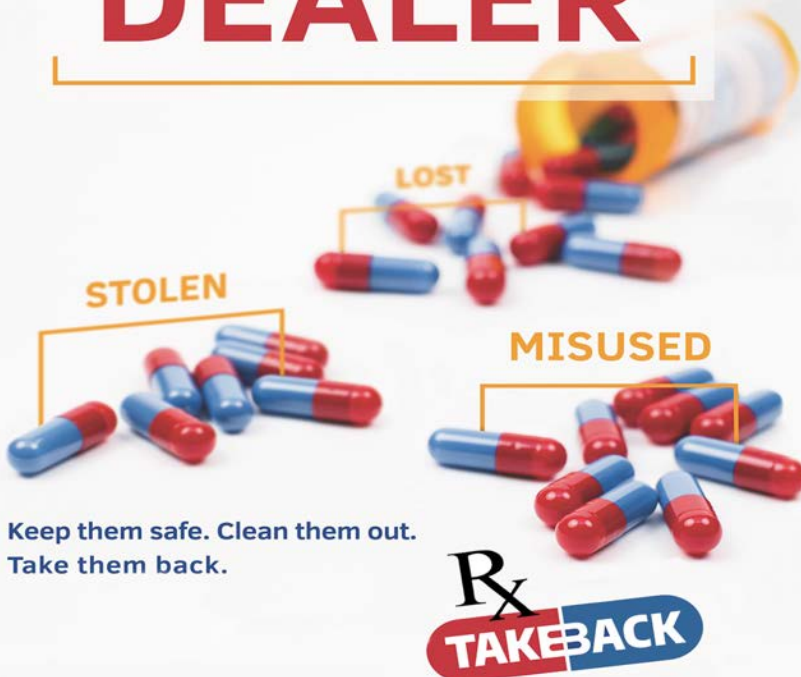

Unfortunately, we were not able to have our Shawna Stovall Children's Back-to-School Pow Wow in our normal fashion again this year due to COVID-19. We had it as a drive through event and handed out 750 Backpacks filled with school supplies, 97 Toddler backpacks and 558 Hair cut voucher for free haircuts. - You must live within the following States and counties listed: ARKANSAS – Benton, Carrol, Crawford, Franklin, Madison & Washington.

KANSAS – Allen, Anderson, Bourbon, Cherokee, Crawford, Labette, Linn, Montgomery, Neosho & Wilson.

MISSOURI – Barry, Barton, Cedar, Christian, Dade, Greene, Jasper, Lawrence, McDonald, Newton, Stone & Vernon.

OKLAHOMA – Adair, Cherokee, Craig, Creek, Dela-

ware, Mayes, Muskogee, Nowata, Ottawa, Rogers, Tulsa, Wagoner & Washington.

If you do not live in one of the states and counties listed above, check with the State or Tribal CCDF Programs in your area to see if they can help you.

Opportunities Arise Even in Amidst Tragedy

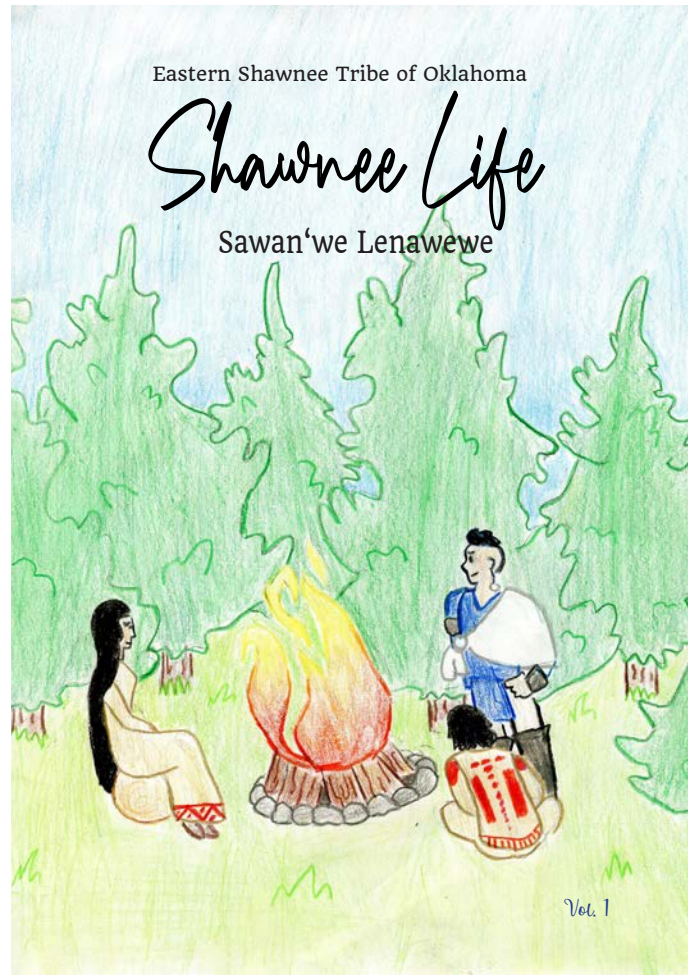

The last year and a half have been a trial for many of us. We've had to adjust how we do our jobs, visit families, and enjoy some of our favorite past times, but even with these changes some good things happen. When the tribe was furloughing many employees, an interesting event began to unfold. The federal government offered a supplemental grant to my program to assist tribal members in any way possible within the scope of the grant. When I worked on this, one of my biggest hopes was to provide counseling and proper means to do the counseling with policies and procedures in place for it. The other was to fill the void this was going to leave with some of our youth, who in times of trouble could reach out to the ceremonial chief and our THPO/Director of Cultural Preservation and be counseled in their way and taught aspects of our culture that could help these individuals when they needed it most.

As originally planned, this would have been a one-on-one peer counseling to help our kids learn about how us Shawnee people interact with this world and the many things that are gifts from our maker. Sadly, the pandemic prevented many from being able to do this due to the quarantine and many who were tragically stricken with this illness. It was discussed and agreed upon that taking some of the knowledge that would have been taught and doing it in a respectful manner, we would put this in writing and while conveying the spiritual significance of this matter and offer some other tidbits of information regarding the topic and to have images depicting some of the information within each topic.

So, knowing which topics we would discuss, the race was on. The ceremonial chief began supplying info on the topic he wished to speak on the most and I began compiling what I knew and researching facts to add to our own information. Paul Barton who had just assumed the new role of THPO/Cultural Director would assist Shawn and Brett on approving what would be appropriate to have in the book and Brett who was now the Language Director would gather and share what these topics Shawnee words were and how to say them.

We then began the difficult task of posting job opportunities and choosing the artists we felt would fit our book the most. Those qualifications were tribal first and our youth were given our top priority as this was intended for them and to encourage those that had the spark of creativity we needed. We finally settled on five artists whose work, enthusiasm and passion for our project told us these were the ones to carry this vision forward. It was a trying ordeal. For months we worked together with our illustrators as a team, fine tuning each piece of art to fit that which it represented and still al-

lowed them the creativity to make it their own. If we were the heart of the project, they were the soul giving so much in the images they provided.

As this progressed, we would share our progress with the advisory board of the Native Connections program which helped us stay on track with our intended goal. Finally, after all this the book took shape and with the skillful work of our ESTO Print Shop staff the book layout was complete. It was printed and shipped on August 18th, 2021, which means as you're reading this article you may have already seen the book. It is my deepest desire this book assists each and everyone of you in some fashion, whether it is to teach you about your heritage or to give you hope when you need it. That is what it was created for. We are tribal people and without each other we cannot be a tribe.

Propagating Your Houseplants

Grow your plant collection for free!



Propagate your plant babies.

If you're a new plant parent that the pandemic has helped cultivate, allow me to introduce you to an affordable way to expand your collection. It's called propagation, and it's the act of creating new plants from existing ones.

There are a few ways to go about propagating a plant: dividing roots of an existing plant or rooting a cutting or leaf in either water or soil. The method you choose will vary depending on the type of plant with which you're working.

Propagation is, by nature, experimental and doesn't always have a 100-percent success rate. Be patient, and don't give up after your first attempt if it doesn't take. You'll increase your chances of success if you propagate plants during the spring and summertime when they're actively growing.

Once you grow more comfortable with the propagation process, you'll want to give away or trade clippings as a way to expand your plant family. It's a great way to share your plant passion with others-or just create little babies of the

ones which you're already attached.

Water to Propagation

Rooting in water is the most common approach for houseplants and the best place to start if you're a propagation beginner. You'll first need a plant such as pothos or devil's ivy with vine-like stems, ones that have little nodes-near where the leaf meets the stem-which is where the new roots will shoot down. Choose a healthy stem, and using sharp shears, cut just below the node and place the stem in a glass jar with room-temperature water. Place the cutting(s) in a spot that receives bright light but not direct sun. Continue checking for new root growth (easy and fun to see through glass jars) and keep the water fresh. When the plant has roots at least two inches long it's ready to be transferred to a pot and planted with potting mix.

Good plants for water propagation include pothos, philodendrons, inch plants, monsteras and fiddle leaf figs.

Soil Propagation

Cuttings from plants with woody stems often take better to rooting in soil. Choose a healthy stem on a mother plant and use a sharp, sterile knife to make a clean cut at a 45-degree angle. The cutting should include the tip of the stem and at least two or three sets of leaves. Take the angled end of the cutting and place into a small pot of soil. Keep the soil moist (but not wet) and wait for roots to grow over weeks or a few months (depending on the plant). To identify whether roots have formed or not, pull lightly on the plants. If they pop right out, they're not fully rooted yet. If you feel some resistance, they're rooted and ready.

Good plants for soil propagation include spider plants, snake plants, jade, succulents, and dragon trees.

Root Division

This method is as simple as it sounds-it involves dividing a mature plant with a large root system into smaller pieces or sections while keeping its existing roots intact. This is a great way to expend your collection if your plant is outgrowing its pot. Some plants, such as aloe or pileas, will shoot up small baby offsets or "pups" at the base of the plant that can be carefully removed and planted directly into soil.

To divide, first pull the plant out of its pot so that all of its roots are exposed. Gently tease and untangle the roots to create separate plants, using a sharp knife or shears to split through tough roots if you aren't able to pull apart by hand. Repot each plant in separate pots and watch as they become well established.

Good plants to propagate with root divisions include peace lilies, ZZ plants, pileas (Chinese money plant) and aloe.

Program Update:

Hello all –

This month we are focusing on preparedness, whether that be preparedness from storms, viruses, or preparedness for a victim of violence to leave at a moments notice.

Did you know that 1 in 4 women (24.3%) and 1 in 7 men (13.8%) aged 18 and older in the United States have been the victim of severe physical violence by an intimate partner in their lifetime?

“Think about your closest circle of friends. Now, notice the statistic above. 1 in 4 women. 1 in 7 men. Statistically, someone you know has been a victim of domestic abuse, yet you probably have no idea. Frightening, right?”

We all would like to think it would never happen to us or someone we know, but the reality is that it does happen. There are warning signs of abuse that we should be aware of, both in our own relationships and those of others around us. Plus, abuse can be more than just physical or emotional—sexual, financial and digital are a few other forms abuse can take.

If you live with your partner and begin to notice the red flags, or sense a friend may be in trouble, it’s a good idea to be prepared to leave when nec-



essary. One way to do this is to keep a “go bag” ready and waiting. This way, in case of an emergency situation, you are able to leave immediately with all the essentials.

Your go bag could include:

- Birth certificates and social security cards for yourself and your children
- Driver’s license and/or passports
- Marriage, divorce or custody papers
- Legal protection or restraining orders
- Health insurance cards and medical records
- Immunization records
- Car title, registration, and insurance documentation
- Cash and prepaid credit cards that can’t be traced
- Prepaid cell phone or a cell phone with a new contract and number. Try to keep it fully charged.
- Current medications and prescriptions for yourself and your children
- Clothing for you and children
- Keepsakes
- Spare set of keys

Keep your go bag somewhere you could easily access it if you had to leave in a hurry. Some ideas might be in the trunk of your car, near your front door, or at a trusted friend’s house. Try to keep your phone charged and your car

full of gas, just in case.

In many cases, returning to your home once you leave may not be an option. If you do feel the need to return for more items, make sure you are keeping your safety in mind. Consider when you might be able to go when your abuser won’t be home, and bring someone with you, such as a friend or police escort.

If you have questions Haven advocates are always here to listen and walk through a safety plan. Also, loveisrespect advocates are available 24/7/365 to talk to you about your relationship, whether that’s identifying abusive behaviors or helping you find safety.

OVEN FRIED CHICKEN WITH GARLIC

We already know that frying chicken in the oven is much easier, but this recipe takes “easy” to a whole new level. The coating gets nice and crispy while the inside stays juicy and tender.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 ½ Pounds boneless, skinless chicken breasts, 4 halves
- Kosher salt, to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon paprika

DIRECTIONS

Heat the oven to 400 F/200c. Put the butter and olive oil in a 8-or 9-inch square baking pan (or a pan large enough to fit the chicken without crowding); place it in the oven to melt the butter. This should take only 1 to 2 minutes, so watch care-

fully to make sure it doesn't burn. When the butter in the pan is melted and sizzling, remove the pan from the oven. Blot the chicken with paper towels and remove any excess fat. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Put the flour, garlic powder, and paprika in a bowl or pie pan. Stir to blend thoroughly. Dredge the chicken in the flour mixture. Arrange them in the hot pan and return to the oven. Bake the chicken for 15 minutes. Carefully turn the chicken with a spatula and return to the oven for another 10 to 15 minutes. The chicken should register 165 F/73.9 C on a food thermometer in the thickest pieces.

The Meth and Suicide Prevention Initiative (MSPI) provides grant funds for innovative tribal programs that focus on methamphetamine and suicide prevention and treatment. The initiative includes research, education, resource management and behavioral health referrals.

We'll be working to develop community-based, culturally sensitive programs. These programs include meth and suicide response teams. We'll coordinate services among law enforcement, medical professionals, our tribal departments, and the community to address the underlying causes of meth abuse and suicide.

A significant component of the initiative will be education programs for children, youth, caregivers and teachers. We'll also be putting into place a method of referring people affected by meth and suicide to facilities which can help them through the recovery process.

Direct to Vendor Claim Form

There are times when everyone faces a struggle when they can't afford to pay for dental work, get a new pair of glasses or pay a medical bill without having to use Care Credit or take out a personal loan. Instead of placing yourself in debt, you can have Social Services pay for the services directly to your health care provider from your health care or disabled/elder benefit. Complete a Direct to Vendor Payment Expense Claim form and attach your ORIGINAL billing statement.

HOW TO REQUEST REIMBURSEMENT

RESOLUTION NUMBER 07282-R-07 2021 Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Business Committee of the Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma hereby approves the submission of the fiscal year 2021 Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program (NTUA-TBC-TBCPO-2021-2006948) by ITC (Inter-Tribal Council, Inc.) a Tribal organization.

The grant is to fund the implementation of a Qualifying Broadband Service which has a minimum downstream speed of 25 Mbps and a minimum upstream speed of 3 Mbps, with a latency

sufficient to support real time, interactive applications, and which has been designed to provide service to last-mile unserved households, anchor institutions, surrounding communities, and businesses.

A qualified RF (Radio Frequency) Engineering Firm will oversee the deployment, installation and acceptance testing of the system. The deliverable will include an RF Engineering Network Design/Build Report, a fully functional infrastructure which is carrier neutral and complies with NTIA’s open network requirements, allowing all carriers to interconnect with these networks on a fair and non-discriminatory terms and conditions, final commissioning and testing to ensure the network is compliant with the 25/3 network speed. The project submission will include the SF-424, CD-511, SF LLL, SF 424C, SF-424D, the project narrative, a preliminary network diagram, and a statement of The Tribe’s interest in receiving funding from the Treasury’s Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund as referenced in Section B.1 of the NOFO. The application is prepared for the Department of Commerce, National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) for the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program Grant Funding.

The tribe will comply with federal environmental and cultural requirements specified in NEPA and NHPA for the construction of infrastructure for broadband deployments.
