GAMING COMMISSIONER, JALENE WELLS:

This report is based on March 2019.

Employees: The department currently has 59 employees (15 in the Gaming Commission Department, 39 in the Surveillance Department, and 5 in the Surveillance Technical Department). Of these 16 are Tribal members, one (1) Tribal spouse, and six (5) Native Americans. Licensing: This area processed 79 new hires and renewals, 5 gaming companies, 32 gaming vendor employees, 12 non-gaming companies, 31 non-gaming vendor employees, collected \$7,556.00 in gaming vendor fees, \$2,675.00 in non-gaming vendor fees, and \$10,550.00 in employee licensing fees.

Electronic Gaming Machines: There were 17 new machine installs, 41 machine software/theme conversions, 14 machines removed, 24 software upgrades, 5 software replacements, 4 gaming machine relocations, 1 server install/upgrade, 235 single pieces of software tested, \$1,925.00 machine fees billed, and \$1,925.00 machine fees collected.

Technical Department: Currently the Department supports and maintains over 1,200 cameras; 162 access control doors; 26 work stations; 30 servers with fail over; Air Fiber; and three (3) battery backup appliances. There are ten (10) buildings with Surveillance on Genetec (three (3) casinos, Travel Center, Wellness Center, Learning Center, James Greenfeather Bldg., BlueJacket Bldg., Annex, and the Police Department). General Maintenance was performed on all cameras at Indigo Sky Casino. This month the department rearranged the Surveillance Room to host 12 stations, 2 lead stations, and a lead office. Worked with Casino IT to install new phones. They also performed regular maintenance on cameras throughout all facilities and install new cameras in necessary locations. Training: Several staff members attended various conferences and trade shows during the month such as: OTGRA and NIGA.

It 119 is not necessary that at the time an injury is sustained by a 120 worker he or she is doing the work on which his or her 121 compensation is based or that the event is within the time 122 limits on which industrial insurance or medical aid premiums or 123 assessments are paid. 124 2nd Council Daugherty made the motion and 1st Council Gardner 125
