36 **Premier Consulting**

Brief overview of new plan – Have 82% loss ratio at this time. The month of July the lose ratio spiked and was 133%. Could have been catch up or claims filed had not made it through the system. Nothing out of the norm.

EHCP fund is currently at 2.6 million. We're not pushing it out into the
insurance world but keeping it here. Need to do some analytics on
where we need to keep that money as it keeps creeping up and up.

a great event and raised the revenue for July. 61

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In January when former management left, we were able to go into the 63 office of the person that was taking care of the Bordertown books and 64 look at them. Their books were not kept by Indigo Sky and Outpost 65 Accounting Department. We found that Indigo Sky had supplemented 66 Bordertown over 1 million dollars per year. Between 2015 - 2018, 4.7 67 million dollars was transferred to Bordertown from Indigo Sky to keep 68 the doors open. Bull events did not increase Indigo Sky Casino revenues 69 70 as expected.

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In 2019 when we took over I instructed the Accounting Department to 72 transfer \$289,000.00 to Bordertown to pay all past due accounts, and 73 \$85,000.00 just to pay wages for that month, We've tried to rework 74 things to cut expenses and production: tried different payout structure 75 to the bulls, reduced events not needed, reduced two food venues down 76 to one, reduced a hefty, hefty management, reduced manpower and 77 reduced hours. Nothing we did covered what bull production cost. It just 78 cost too much. I have informed the bull owners that there would be no 79 2020 season. Bordertown can not continue as a gaming facility and will 80 close at the end of December for that venue. 81

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There is an agreement with a machine vendor and they did supplement 83 Bordertown to the tune of \$12,500.00 and \$70,000.00 respectively 84 every month. The \$12,500.00 ended at the end of July and the 85

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\$70,000.00 will end in February. \$82,000.00 that normally came to
Bordertown will be gone when that agreement ends.
